As our Kiwi tamariki grow and learn they are becoming more independent and developing their self-help skills. When they are ready, the Kiwi tamariki have lots of opportunities to extend their self-help skills such as practicing using a spoon at meal times and using a flannel to wash their own face and hands.

Supporting our tamariki to practice their self-help skills is a fantastic way to help them feel capable and develop ownership and a sense of empowerment in their own abilities. Self-help skills enable tamariki to meet their own needs and involve activities and behaviours that eventually lead to independence.
